KNOXVILLE CONVENTION CENTER HOSTS SOUTHEASTERN ARCHAEOLOGICAL CONFERENCE

Can you dig it? The Knoxville Convention Center (KCC) proves that it can, welcoming the 64th annual meeting of the Southeastern Archaeological Conference, Nov. 1-3.

Hosted by the Archaeological Research Laboratory and Department of Anthropology at the University of Tennessee, the annual meeting will feature scholars from throughout the Southeast presenting papers on various aspects of both prehistoric and historic archaeology.

On Saturday, Nov. 3, at 8:30 a.m., the conference will hold a session on the archaeology of Tennessee. The public is invited to attend this session free of charge. Speakers will focus on topics such as "Tennessee's Past and Present Environments," "A History of Archaeology in Tennessee" and "The Future of Tennessee Archaeology."

The Southeastern Archaeological Conference expects to attract more than 650 visitors to Knoxville.
